





NURSING REGISTRATION & RECIPROCITY/ENDORSEMENT

In Canada, nursing is a profession that includes 3 regulated nursing groups:

- Registered Nurse (RN), Licensed
- Practical Nurse (LPN)*, or
- Registered Psychiatric Nurse (RPN).



NURSING REGISTRATION & RECIPROCITY/ENDORSEMENT

In British Columbia, Ontario and Nova Scotia, all categories of nurses are regulated by a single college.

In all other provinces and territories, each nursing category has its own regulatory body.







British Columbia College of Nurses & Midwives

- You graduated from an approved registered nurse (RN) nursing program
- Within the last five years you graduated from that nursing program OR practiced 1,125 hours as a nurse (confirmed by your employer)

How to apply

Internationally - Educated Nurses (IENs)

Note:

- nursing education and practice in Australia, New Zealand, the United Kingdom and the United
 States as largely comparable to registered nursing practice in Canada
- BCCNM assesses most IEN applicants for RN and LPN registration at the same time through one application.

How to apply

Internationally- Educated Nurses (IENs)

Steps:

- Apply to NCAS Nursing Community Assessment Service https://www.ncasbc.ca
 - English language proficiency
 - Educational credentials; and
 - Nursing skills and knowledge through a competency assessment (if required).

Applicants educated in Australia, New Zealand, the United Kingdom or the United States may not have to complete a competency assessment

Steps:

- 4 Provisional Registration and Registration Exam
 - NCLEX -RN, REx -PN (required)
 - Provisional license registration (want to work while meeting their outstanding registration requirements)

- Official transcripts showing university program completion in English (for programs that are minimum two years length)
- The cost of this is payable by the applicant.

- National Nursing Assessment Service (NNAS), Nursing Community Assessment Service (NCAS) or other credential recognition report
- Employment verification
- Canadian English Language Benchmark Assessment for Nurses (CELBAN) or International English Language Testing System (IELTS) test results from within the last two years meeting cut scores

You are required to obtain CNPS professional liability protection. There are two options for this purchase:

Designated Countries Pathway

IENs who were educated and who are currently licensed in good standing in <u>USA</u>, <u>UK</u>, <u>Ireland</u>, <u>India</u>, <u>Philippines</u>, <u>Australia or</u>

New Zealand are eligible to apply for registration in Newfoundland & Labrador using the designated countries pathway.





Eligibility Criteria - Designated Countries Pathway Required Documents

- a. Two (2) government issued identification documents.
- b. Change of Name documentation such as marriage certificate and/or legal change of name document (if applicable)
- c. A current Criminal Record Check (<6 months old). Please see the CRC Factsheet for additional information.
- d. Educational Credential Assessment (ECA)

Zone 1: Candidates educated in USA

Zone 2: Candidates educated in New Zealand, Australia, United Kingdom or Ireland

Zone 3: Candidates educated in France, Hong Kong, or Belgium

Zone 4: Candidates educated in United Arab Emirates (UAE), India, Philippines, Morocco, Lebanon, or Switzerland.

Zone 5: Candidates educated in all other countries





General Requirements: (varies depending on zone)

- 1. Apply to the National Nursing Assessment Service (NNAS)
- 2. Complete the NANB application
 Once you have received your NNAS Advisory Report, you may apply to NANB.
- 3. Pay applicable fees
- 4. Demonstrate Currency of Practice
- 5. Demonstrated success on the entryto-practice exam (NCLEX-RN).

Immigration Pathway

International Mobility Program:
Canada-United States-Mexico
Agreement (CUSMA)

• Facilitates temporary entry for business persons who are citizens of the U.S., Mexico and Canada and who are involved in the trade of goods or services, or in investment activities.



CUSMA Professional Work Permit for Registered Nurses

Eligibility Requirements:

Citizenship: foreign nationals must be either American or Mexican Citizens

Educational Requirements: must have a nursing or closely related diploma/degree

Licensing Requirement: to be authorized to enter Canada as a registered nurse, a license issued by the province of destination is necessary

Job Offer: must have an Offer of Employment/Employment Agreement between the foreign national and the Canadian entity.

Admissible to Canada: the foreign national must be admissible to Canada (no criminal inadmissibility or bans from entering Canada)

CUSMA Professional Work Permit for Registered Nurses

Supporting Documents:



A copy of the foreign national's diploma in Nursing in a closely related field



Curriculum Vitae/Resume for the foreign national

Employment agreement / Offer of Employment between the foreign national and the Canadian entity


A letter from the Canadian entity in support of the work permit application

Confirmation of submission of LMIA Exempt Offer of Employment

Application Process

A foreign national can apply at the port of entry (Canadian airport or land border) for a CUSMA-based Professional work permit.

The foreign national must bring with them the work permit application package and the work permit will be processed and issued at the port of entry. Can take hours to process depending on how busy the port of entry is.



A CUSMA-based
 Professional Work
 Permit can be issued for up to 3 years;

 However, if the offer of employment is for a shorter duration then the work permit will coincide with the duration of employment


